

The Children's Home named among top nonprofits in the nation

The Children's Home has been selected as one of the 2020 Best Nonprofits to Work For by The NonProfit Times, a leading national business publication for non-profit organizations.

Partnering with an independent research organization, The NonProfit Times recognizes and honors top employers in the nonprofit sector that have excelled in creating quality workplaces to accompany meaningful missions.

The Children's Home was named as one of the top 50 nonprofits in the nation.

"It's a great honor to be selected," said John Banchy, president and CEO of The Children's Home. "This award belongs to the amazing people who comprise The Children's Home and who continue to serve even during these unprecedented times."

To be selected, organizations are subjected to an in-depth survey and questionnaire. Through nearly 80 questions, which remain anonymous, people who work across the nation in the nonprofit sector rate subjects such as relevance of their work, company benefits, and how well their company promotes professional development.

"We very quickly changed how we provide service to our community in light of the global crisis," said Banchy. "Children and families who need us simply don't vanish when there's a pandemic. We've served Cincinnati since 1864 and we'll continue to find innovative ways to serve our community."

Banchy said many of the organization's behavioral health counseling services have evolved into a telephone or video based setting, the CoStars preschool facility has been deemed pandemic certified and is open for healthcare workers, first responders and other qualifying personnel; the education campus has switched to a distance learning model and the Levine Family Health Center is still accepting appointments.

The Children's Home has 30 distinct programs that provide service in 176 community locations in the Greater Cincinnati area. Their services address educational and behavioral health challenges, poverty, provide job and life skills coaching, and services for at-risk parents.

Last year, the organization served 14,273 children and families in life-changing ways in Greater Cincinnati and surrounding areas.

"It's not business as usual but our staff has adapted how we serve in record time," Banchy said. "What makes us stand out to a national publication like the Nonprofit Times is the amazing men and women who work here."
